## Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,



Many medieval churches housed burials and contain even glass-cased skeletons. Many European cathedrals contain tombs of the dearly deceased. Most contemporary churches avoid picturing those bones that are left after the flesh has rotted away. Our culture avoids dealing directly and honestly with death: many people are even replacing the verb “died” with the term “passed,” as if with everyone going off to heaven, there really is no death.

I’m sorry, but I really, really, hate euphemisms for death. The season of Lent presented us with the images of the grave, the stink of bodily decomposition, in Jesus’ miracle of raising Lazarus. Paul’s use of the term “flesh” as a metaphor for the misused human life intensifies honesty about human mortality.

In this way, the Bible addresses death head on. There is no softening of the word. There is no euphemism. There is death, a horrible reality.

Then there is Easter! Then there is life! The Christian message to the world is this message: *“Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.”* Death is real. But God is real, too. God’s love is real. And God’s love conquers death through the death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

So rejoice, even though so much of the world is in chaos and agony. Rejoice, even though our country is being egged on by social media toward greater and greater division, greater and greater anger, and greater and greater violence. ***Rejoice this Easter season, knowing death has already been beaten by life, sin has been mastered by God’s grace in Christ, sorrow has been uplifted by the Spirit.***



**Devotions: Pastor Paul:** Readings from the book of Ezekiel and opening prayer

**Pastor's Report:** Mileage was average. He attended council meetings, Zumbro River Conference meeting for Pastors, provided services at Fieldcrest and Prairie Meadows. No vacation taken to date. Confirmation class members are being asked to attend Lenten Services on Wednesday evenings. The council approved as presented.

**Secretary's Report:** Last joint meeting December 8<sup>th</sup>. Review of the minutes. Randy Robertson motioned to approve as read and carried.

**Parsonage Committee:** Boiler was checked, some water down but within limits and have not seen evidence of further rodent infestation. Liquid added for tub drain and sink. Jane picked up new carbon monoxide detectors.

**Education Committee Report:** Luther League 27<sup>th</sup> of March Pizza Party and Easter Egg Hunt March 29<sup>th</sup> (Palm Sunday); First Communion March 15<sup>th</sup> (2 from West)

**Old Business:**

**Parsonage Project:** No additional report

**Church Times:** Has been a couple of months since the change and asking for feedback. Some would prefer to change it back to 9 and 11. East and West noted smaller attendance with the early 8:30am time. Summer hours are 8:30 and 10:00, so we'll keep it for now, and review again at the June joint meeting in order to confirm or change the worship times starting in September.

**New Business:**

**Norm Senjem Proposal:**

Norm presented to the joint council on the Parsonage proposal. Norm introduced himself and noted that the original proposal was intended as a starting point. The next step is to explore further with comments and feedback,

work with their lawyer, and prepare a letter of intent to be discussed/reviewed and later a formal proposal. Norm presented an estimated cost of the property transfer to the council broken down into Pre-Sale, creation of 5-7 acre parcel, and closing services fees. It was noted that septic and well would need to be completed pre-sale. **Q:** Once split and sold, it will revert to a taxed property – tax evaluation will occur once deed clears. Suggestion to see if an estimate can be made. **Q:** After the 15 years and it comes back to the church, does it switch back to tax exempt (would need to check with the county). Suggestion to explore lease option, where the property would stay in the church's name (would need to consult with a lawyer as well). Consideration/discussion of potential worth/benefit in the future post renovation. If later sold, there are considerations that need to be made for the cabin as well. The township was agreeable previously to drawing new lines for a one acre plot for the cabin, however that may have changed with "new" rules. The cabin may be connected to the parsonage parcel or the cemetery parcel, but that is a discussion for another day There are still questions about capital gains, what is the current value, could parsonage funds be used for an appraisal? Discussion about surveying the congregation was discussed.

A motion for East and West Councils to make a list of questions of unknowns to get more details regarding Norms proposal on the parsonage was made by Hans Estey for next joint meeting, Cindy Stoppel seconded, motion carried.


