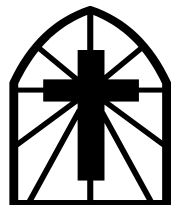

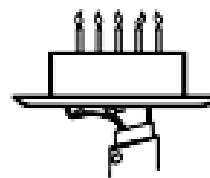

A PLACE YOU SHOULD VISIT!!!

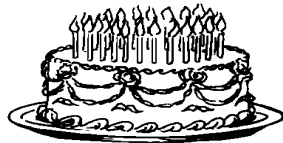
Being that many of you are of Norwegian heritage; if you have never been to visit the Vesterheim Museum in Decorah, Iowa; I highly suggest that you make the trip if you are able to. Even if one is not of Norwegian heritage (*I am not*) – **the museum is fantastic!** The innumerable historic items at the museum are highly interesting! The cost is very reasonable too; it was only \$15 for a day-pass (*so you can tour a couple of floors then go out for lunch and return to tour some more*). There are also historic buildings to tour outside – I need to make a return trip for those; because we opted to hike up to see Dunning Spring Waterfall before we headed home that day. Decorah is a very interesting town with many historic homes to walk around and see (one you can tour: The Porter House Museum – also very interesting). Also, near Decorah is the American Seed Savers Exchange farm which grows and sells seeds for many heirloom flowers and vegetables – yet another interesting place to visit; and they have many hiking trails there too.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Randy Robertson

Pastor's Report: Same as above

Secretary's Report: Report approved; motion from Randy, motion carried

Financial Secretary's Report: ESO May offerings, Current \$4,967 and Benevolence \$125 motion from Randy, motion carried

Treasurer's Report: First half of real estate tax, paid WSO for first quarter of the year. Jim Rushton paid for services. Other bills are regularly scheduled outgoing. Motion from Randy, motion carried to approve. Bill for fire extinguisher inspection received.

Deacon's Report: June 14th 170th celebration of the ESO Parish – Joint service at 10am inside the sanctuary followed by lunch and tours of the cabin. June 21st Father's Day Brunch.

Trustees Report: Josh Fjerstad finished the south and west steps / front door. Rust prohibitor and paint completed and power washing. Josh confirmed that the interior paint on the ceiling needs to completely be removed and repainted (paint comes off in very small pieces). New bid to complete entire ceiling instead of time+labor. Jane motions we accept the build of the ceiling under balcony. Jane motions we accept the build to paint all under balcony for \$2450, motion 2nd by Jeff, council unanimously approved the motion. Planning to fill hole under the gutter along the parking lot (near Pastor parking). Trustees will follow up on extinguisher count and type to validate bill received by Gary, (bill noted in Financial report).

Education Report: No report

Parsonage Report: Randy and Pete met with Tracy Fogelson. Estimated \$300-\$325K sale price. \$75-100K less set aside for septic/well. Market value estimate \$345K. Detailed estimate received for demo, removal, etc. to be shared – ~\$23,290 with \$7,400 asbestos removal for total \$30,690.

Old Business: Review of past new business, no changes

New Business: Creation of pros/cons of the parsonage options. Should we take a look at breakdown of annual giving by age group and complete some future projections?

Adjournment: Jane motion to adjourn, Bryan 2nd. Motion carries.

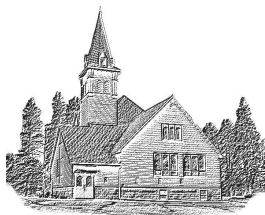
